Notes

I have no return for two folks who registered.

At all the controls the quality of the map left something to be desired, so mistakes might be forgiven because of that. #1 and #2 were particularly affected by this.

1. I am pretty sure that the kite was located at the mapped crag, but depending on what nearby features I used to locate it, the kite could have been up to 5m one way or other along the slope.
2. Here, the kite seemed to be almost at the top of the shallow re-entrant, but it was in the correct location relative to the small quarry (kite C) and the spur (kite A).
3. This was a straightforward problem, with B being on the hill top.
4. 58% chose A as the correct kite, but this was on the SE side of the hill, not on the NE side. This was quite difficult to see from the decision point but could be spotted by wandering down the route to the SOL Start until the A kite disappeared behind the hill, thus indicating that it was on the far, south, side of the east end of the hill. Thus, none of the kites were on the NE side and the answer was Z. This control was typical of the sneaky problems set by Trail-O planners.
